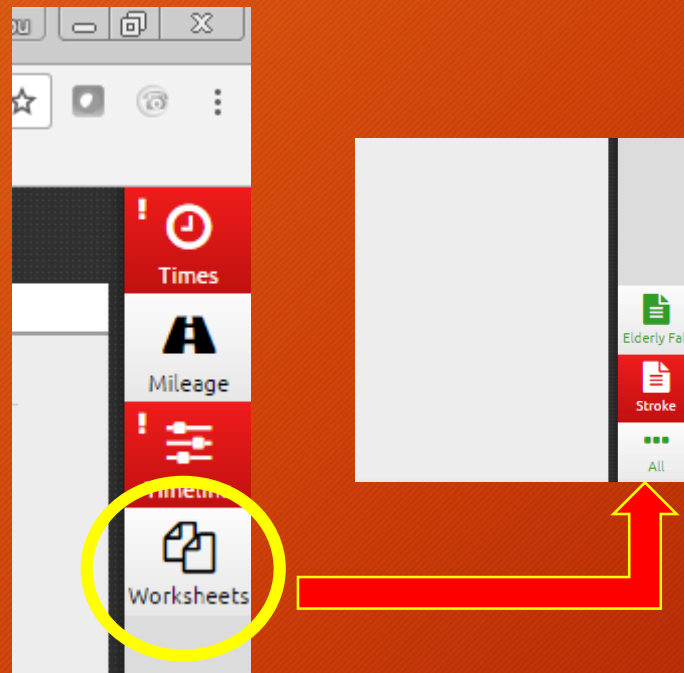
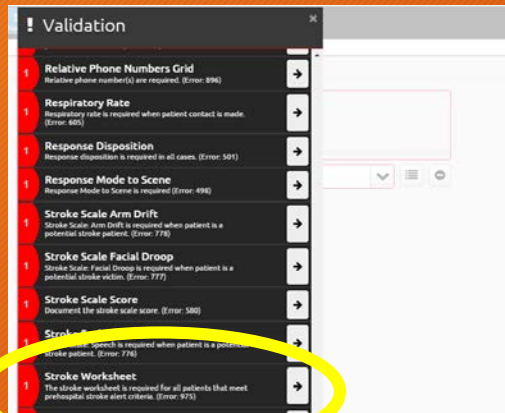
Stroke Worksheet - Validation

1	Relative Phone Numbers Grid	Relative phone number(s) are required.	896
1	Respiratory Rate	Respiratory rate is required when patient contact is made.	605
1	Response Disposition	Response disposition is required in all cases.	501
1	Response Mode to Scene	Response Mode to Scene is required	498
1	Stroke Scale Arm Drift	Stroke Scale: Arm Drift is required when patient is a potential stroke patient.	778
1	Stroke Scale Facial Droop	Stroke Scale: Facial Droop is required when patient is a potential stroke victim.	777
1	Stroke Scale Score	Document the stroke scale score.	580
1	Stroke Scale Speech	Stroke Scale: Speech is required when patient is a potential stroke patient.	776
1	Stroke Worksheet	The stroke worksheet is required for all patients that meet prehospital stroke alert criteria.	975

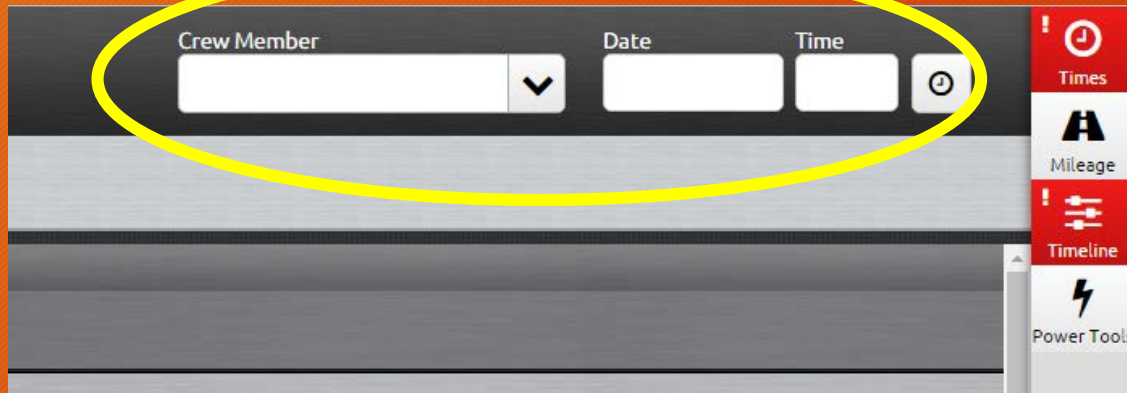
- The stroke worksheet will be required for patients that meet VCEMS Stroke Alert Criteria.

Stroke Worksheet - Accessing the Worksheet



- You can click the arrow next to the highlighted stroke worksheet in validation, then click the red stroke button to open the worksheet, OR:
- Click the worksheets button, then click the red stroke worksheet to open the form.

Stroke Worksheet - History

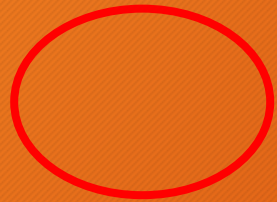
- Answer each as yes / no, based on the patient's medical history

Stroke Worksheet - Anticoagulant Medications

- Document any / all anticoagulant medication the patient is currently taking.
 - Each field requires a yes / no answer.
 - If the patient is prescribed an anticoagulant not listed on the worksheet, document the medication in the 'Other (describe)' field at the bottom of the section.
